Edouardo Giacone, formerly a sales director for Fiat in London, was inspired to live his dream by a bad holiday to Umbria. 'My girlfriend and I went to stay at a hotel that looked incredible on the website but was a huge disappointment,' he recalls. 'We decided we really wanted to create something truly special."

The couple then spent every weekend flying from Stansted to their native Italy, scouring the country for suitable properties. When they came across the 16thcentury Villa Armena in the Tuscan countryside, 20 minutes from Siena, it was merely an intact grand façade, with wild animals living in the ruins.

Two years and a £3.7million restoration later, the villa is a luxurious boutique resort, with ten spacious bedrooms, extensive gardens, an outdoor pool and bar. We don't want to be just another hotel, we want people to really feel they are on holiday, getting away from it all,' says Giacone.

The property is listed, so features many traditional Tuscan elements including terracotta floors and original oak beams. 'But it is absolutely state-of-theart, too - we took no prisoners with that,' he says. There is wi-fi throughout, 32in flat-screen TVs and radios in the ultra-modern
